Discussion Questions *Along a Storied Trail*by Ann H. Gabhart

During the Great Depression, many were in desperate situations with the bank failures, no jobs to be found and no way to provide for their families. Do you think the work projects that President Roosevelt established were the best way to help people in need? Why or why not?

After the first Eastern Kentucky county took advantage of the Packhorse Librarian project, nearly all of the other Eastern Kentucky counties wanted a similar library in their areas. Why do you think the project was so popular in Eastern Kentucky?

Many in the Eastern Kentucky Appalachian communities had never had access to libraries and most had no books in their homes other than their Bibles. Can you imagine not having access to a library or to books of any kind? How has being a library patron made your life better?

Did you have a favorite character in the story? If so, who and why?

Perdita Sweet had a tendency toward contrariness. Did you like her in spite of that or perhaps because of that? Have you known people like her who simply can't seem to find a way to be happy no matter their situations? Or perhaps on the other side of the coin, people who do find a way to be cheerful in spite of those less than ideal situations?

Why do you think the loss of the American chestnut trees was an even harder blow to the mountain communities all through the Appalachian Mountains? Do you think foresters who are trying to find ways to bring back the American chestnut trees will ever be successful?

Tansy loved her job as a packhorse librarian. Why do think that was true? What was it that made her so happy to be riding the rough trails to take books to her mountain neighbors?

Why do you think Perdita was so ready to take Coralee under her wings?
